Criteria for Tenure and Promotion to Associate Professor

Thegranting of tenure is a judgment based on past performance and potential for future contributions. Tenure will be recommended by the School f, and only if, in the judgment of the School, the candidate has demonstrated a sustained ecord of productivity along with evidence that the candidate will continue to be an excellent scholar in Socia Work, a first rate teacher, and a good colleague and citizen of the School college and university.

Candidates are evaluated entirely on their own personal merit, and tenure is awarded

studentsand the status of the School Socia Work doctoral program.

Therefore, while faculty are encouraged o serve on dissertation committees, the evidence for these activities will take into account the related opportunities at the time.

Service

The third area of contribution which is to be assessed service. Excellence n service is manifested by substantive contributions in one or more of the following areas service to the University (department, college, and university service), the social work profession, and engagement with the community. We expect consistent participation in service that is necessary for the smooth operation of the School.
